Master Class: Josef Albers and His Students - Museum Inaugurates Master Class series exploring relationships between great artists and their students who went on to fame - At The Manes Center - The Manes Center is open Tuesday to Sunday, 11:00 AM to 4:45 PM. There is nothing like the relationship of teacher and student, a bond that becomes all the more enduring when the student rises to become a notable artist in his or her own right. This exhibition brings together the Museum's own Formulation: Articulation portfolio by Josef Albers with notable works by some of his students from Black Mountain College and Yale University. The stunning roll call of Albers' students includes Robert Rauschenberg, Richard Serra (whose masterwork Plumb Line is a highlight of the sculpture collection), Robert Mangold, Peter Halley, and Sol LeWitt.
