include discussions, games, arts, crafts and music programs. Exercise classes, taught by instructors trained by the Arthritis Foundation, encourage movement and include strength training. The strength training provides an opportunity to stretch and strengthen the major muscle groups in a safe and effective manner, to enable the participants to increase range of motion, and improve flexibility.
