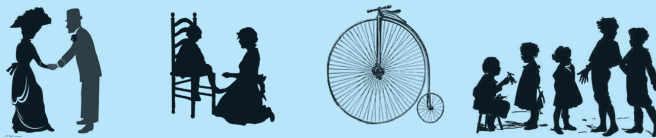

A Virtual Walk Through the Egyptian Galleries at The Metropolitan Museum of Art

Tuesday, October 17th - 7:00 - 8:45 PM
Art lecturer Ines Powell will present "A Virtual Walk Through the Egyptian Galleries at the Metropolitan Museum of Art." The Department of Egyptian Art at the Metropolitan Museum was established in 1906. That same year, the museum began an excavation program in Egypt that continued for 30 years and brought innumerable treasures into the collection. Today, the Met has one of the richest and most comprehensive Egyptian collections in the world. It comprises an estimated 24,000 objects, dating from 3,000 BCE to 400 CE - from pre-historic Egypt to the Byzantine occupation during the reign of the Emperor Justinian. These objects reflect the history, daily life, religious beliefs, and aesthetic values of the ancient Egyptians. Registration is requested for this free event. All are welcome!

Sagamore Hill National Historic Site, home of Theodore Roosevelt is open Wednesday-Sunday. Operating hours for the Visitor Center & Bookstore, Old Orchard Museum, and the Roosevelt Home are 9AM - 5PM. The grounds and nature trail at Sagamore Hill are open 7 days a week year round from sunrise to sunset.

Entering Theodore Roosevelt's Home is by guided tour only. Tours are offered from 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM at a cost of \$10 for adults; those 15 and under are free. Tickets are sold on a first-come-first-served when the Visitor Center is open beginning at 9:00 AM. Each tour is limited to fourteen persons and lasts approximately 45 minutes. Online tickets can be purchased up to six months in advance on Recreation.gov, or by calling 1-877-444-6777. Weekends and especially holiday weekends are very busy, so please plan to visit earlier in the day to secure your tour tickets.
