Bellone Vetoes Suffolk Dem's Gerrymander

A controversial redistricting map for the Suffolk Legislature, pushed through by the outgoing, lame-duck Democrats by a 11 to 8 party-line vote, on New Year's Eve - just hours before they left office - has been vetoed by Suffolk County Executive Steve Bellone (D-Babylon).

The map, denounced as a "Gerrymander," was drawn by the outgoing lame-duck Legislature, which had a Democratic majority, after the Republicans won a majority in this past November's elections. The Democrats ignored the County Charter which assigned the job of drawing districts to a bi-partisan Redistricting Commission, and drew - and then rushed through - their own, highly-partisan map without appointing the bi-partisan Commission.

The Democrats' Gerrymander map "would never have survived legal challenge," stated Bellone. "What we will have now is a process that is legally sustainable and will definitely result in equitable maps that reflect the demographic realities of Suffolk County,"

The Democrats' map would have merged four newly-elected Republicans together, as "punishment" for defeating Democrats in the election, and drawn many Republicans out of their existing districts, to try to force Republicans to sell their homes and move, in order to be eligible to represent their districts.

The Suffolk County Attorney, Dennis

Cohen, a Bellone appointee, issued a legal Opinion that the Democrats' partisan map was "illegal."

In the days leading-up to Bellone's veto, he met repeatedly with the new Presiding Officer of the Legislature, Kevin McCaffrey (R-Babylon). The two struck an agreement that Bellone would veto the Democrats' map, and then McCaffrey would appoint a bi-partisan commission. At least four of the 18 legislative districts would be "majority-minority" and have a black or Hispanic majority population.

The rump Democrats in the Suffolk legislature tried this past Wednesday to block the Bellone McCaffrey agreement, but failed. Bellone ignored their antics and vetoed the map as per his agreement.

According to inside sources, NY Governor Kathy Hochul called Bellone and urged him to betray the agreement he made with McCaffrey, and sign the Gerrymander map. Bellone rejected Hochul's demands.

The Legislature is now expected to appoint the bi-partisan Redistricting Commission, which will draw new districts in accordance with McCaffrey's agreement with Bellone.

"We are going to get a truly bipartisan agreement... and a fair, open and transparent process," stated McCaffrey.

Huntington Sewage Treatment Plant Tour

Legislator Stephanie Bontempi (Centerport) recently visited the Huntington Sewage Treatment Plant for a tour led by Huntington Environmental Waste Management Director John Clark. Bontempi's office coordinated the tour with Huntington Town Supervisor Ed Smyth's office to become more familiar with the facility's role in managing local wastewater. Bontempi felt that acquiring a deeper understanding of the plant and the technologies it utilizes is more important now than ever before, as Suffolk County and the Town of Huntington have plans to significantly increase sewer service.

"The proper management of wastewater is incredibly important here in Suffolk County. As Long Islanders we are well aware of how sensitive our groundwater system is and its relation to other natural resources and our health. Sewer systems accomplish so much as they keep

our water sources clean and can allow for some much-needed revitalization in areas such as Huntington Station," said Bontempi.

The Town of Huntington's Sewer District has a long history going back to the early 20th century and currently services over 35 miles of sewers. Heightened public interest in sewers is testament to how effective such an asset can be when operated as efficiently as Huntington's.

"As a legislator, I think it is important to stay acquainted with not only the latest sewer-related technologies, but with the people who keep the plants running as well. Our environment is certainly fragile, but we can protect it with the right technology and talented people like the employees at the Huntington Sewage Treatment Plant. Huntington's facility is truly a model to which other municipalities should aspire," added Bontempi.

KATHY HOCHUL'S CRUEL FORCED CHILD MASK MANDATES

"Forced child masking is child abuse," stated a local Mom, Cathie Gugliucci of Old Brookville, who has helped organize thousands of Long Island mothers against forced masking.

Child masking is perhaps the cruelest part of two years of life-destroying political manipulation and mismanagement that millions of New York families and children have endured at the hands of the Cuomo-Hochul administration.

This past week, the New York Supreme Court declared that NY Governor Kathy Hochul's forced child masking mandates were "unconstitutional" and "illegal" as being done by Executive fiat - without any authorization or input from the New York State legislature.

This Court ruling came on the heels of an Order from newly-elected Nassau County Executive Bruce Blakeman (R-Long Beach) ending Hochul's forced child masking and vaxxing in Nassau school districts.

Hochul protested that her mandates were due to expire on February 1st, begging for a few more days. But then Hochul filed an appeal - to permanently force back her mask mandates.

The science is increasingly clear that mask mandates - particularly for children - do nothing to stop or slow the spread of Covid. But the negative health consequences can be profound: ingesting plastic particles; elevated blood CO2 levels; skin rashes and irritations; social sensory disruption for children; depression; social isolation; drug abuse; and suicide.

In July, 2021, then Governor Andrew Cuomo ended mask mandates - leaving the choice to parents and local school districts. He made this decision after his Health Department consulted with the state's top doctors and scientists..

But Kathy Hochul is an ambitious politician, and she needed - like a Mafia initiate - to prove herself politically. So without any "scientific" or "medical" experts or data, Hochul announced in August that she would immediately reimpose forced child masking when she became Governor. Just because the powerful teachers unions wanted it.

Hochul was happy to play along with Cuomo when he Ordered sick Covid patients into the nursing homes - infecting and killing over 15,000 New York seniors. And she was happy to do her part in the "cover-up" when her team falsified the death records to conceal over 10,000 of those deaths.

Our schools have been reduced to expensive babysitting services - with child reading and math skills collapsing. And our children are being frightened and isolated.

Last weekend, several thousand local parents joined Bruce Blakeman to demand the end of all New York State forced masking. *The Leader* agrees.

about this handsome man from the Bahamas.


From generation to generation their legacies will be passed
