Republicans Sweep in Historic Election Wins

Republicans swept to huge victories across the North Shore: Oyster Bay Supervisor Joe Saladino won re-election with over 71%; Ed Smyth was elected Huntington Supervisor with 56%; Pam Panzenbeck was elected Glen Cove Mayor with 57%; and Jennifer DeSena became the first Republican Supervisor of North Hempstead in 35 years, winning with 54% of the vote.

Both Nassau and Suffolk Counties experienced a “red wave,” with the Republican Party sweeping most elective offices in what is considered an election bellwether for a move away from Democratic control across the nation.

Republicans crushed in both District Attorney races: in Nassau County with Anne Donnelly at 60%; and in Suffolk County with Ray Tierney at 57%. or Nassau County Executive, incumbent one-term Democrat Laura Curran was ousted by Republican Bruce Blakeman, who won with over 52% of the vote.

Republicans won huge majorities in both the Nassau and Suffolk County Legislatures; won the Town Boards in

Huntington and Oyster Bay; and won the City Council of Glen Cove.

In North Hempstead, Republican David Adhami won the Great Neck seat, becoming the first Persian-American Republican elected ever. His running mate Mazi Pilip, a Falasha refugee from Ethiopia, was elected the first Republican County Legislator from Great Neck ever, defeating a longtime Democrat incumbent.

In Huntington, longtime Huntington Democrat office holder Mark Cuthbertson lost in the Loyd Harbor-Centerport-Northport County Legislative district to first-time Republican candidate Stephanie Bontempi, a teacher at the Greenvale School; Democrat incumbent Susan Berland lost the East Northport- Dix Hills seat to Republican Manny Estaban.

In Oyster Bay, Republican Paolo Pironi won 51% in the hotly-contested race for the north shore, Locust Valley-Bayville-Oyster Bay County Legislature seat. He is beating two-term Democrat Josh Lafazan who trailed with 49%. The mail-in ballots are still to be counted in that race.

Shooting in Heckscher Park Locks Down Schools, Town

This past Monday, November 1st around 9:30 a.m., shots rang out at Heckscher Park in downtown Huntington, prompting police to place surrounding schools and town buildings on a “lockdown.” The shots were fired towards a town employee in a golf cart. Luckily no injuries were sustained.

The town employee, who has not been identified, was working for the town and using a golf cart in Heckscher Park. Suddenly a vehicle pulled up, and several shots were fired at the employee from the car. Then the suspect drove away at high speed.

The suspect has still not been identified.

Huntington town officials and the Suffolk Police thought it best to put local

schools and town facilities under an immediate lockdown. People could neither enter nor leave school buildings, or town facilities, until the “all clear” directive came from the police and the Town that it was safe to reopen. The lockdown was lifted around 12:05PM

“Due to an active Suffolk County Police Department investigation into a shooting in the vicinity of Heckscher Park, where there are no reported injuries, out of an abundance of caution and in accordance with Town policy, Town Hall, the Village Green/Senior Center and Heckscher Park are close and on lockdown,” said Town spokeswoman Lauren Lembo at the time of the incident.

Suffolk Police Inspector William Scrima reported that there are still no new details about the shooting.

Fire Displaces Two Dozen Families

A fire at a Woodbury apartment complex forced over two dozen families out of their homes. The fire, which happened on Monday, November 1st, led to a response from over a dozen fire departments from around the Woodbury area.

The fire occurred at the Eagle Rock apartment complex at Pond Road. The apartments are located adjacent to the Oyster Bay Golf Course and the Fox Hollow Inn, just off Jericho Turnpike in Woodbury.

The fire reportedly started around 8 PM according to officials. Flames engulfed both floors of the apartment, as well as the windows and front door when firefighters arrived at the scene.

Other buildings in the area took damage as well. Residents at the apartment

complex were able to be evacuated safely, as no one sustained any injuries from the flames.

Fire departments in Syosset, Plainview, Hicksville, Melville, Locust Valley, Cold Spring Harbor, Huntington Manor, East Norwich, Bethpage, Westbury, and Oyster Bay all responded to the fire.

Op-Ed: NYS Pension Contributions Drop – But Are Still Too High

Finally some good news: New York State Comptroller Tom DiNapoli (D-Great Neck) announced that due to a rising stock market, the amount of contribution that taxpayers must funnel into the state pension fund this year will slightly decline.

It's still a huge number, but it's good to see that the recovering market has taken some strain off of local budgets.

However, an analysis of the per-employee contribution illustrates just how expensive these public pensions have become for taxpayers to sustain.

First, it's important to note that the pension system is not the same for every public employee. Many workers in various parts of the government retire with pensions that are far from extravagant .

The largest collectors are those in retired law-enforcement.

While taxpayers have to contribute about 11.6% of a non-police employee's overall costs to keep the fund above water, that figure is more than double for the average law enforcement pension.

Police pensions are so lucrative that they require a match that is nearly double that for other employees within the system. Contribution for law-enforcement went down a few percentage points, but it's still at a whopping 27%.

When we're looking to calculate how much it costs to put another police officer

out on the street, we can't just look at their salary and health care benefits. We have to tack on an additional 25% just to cover the pension costs of other law-enforcement employees who have retired.

Readers of this column often ask, "So what can we do about it?"

Our Center has called on the state legislature to end Mandatory Arbitration, which has helped these salaries and pension costs spiral, while also calling for an end to the inclusion of overtime pay into the calculation of a worker's pension.

Taxpayer frustration should not be directed toward the employees themselves, who are merely receiving what has been bargained for. Taxpayer wrath should focus on the elected officials who - with a wink and a nod - acquiesce to these distorted contracts when they are supposed to be representing the tax paying public.

It's not a question as to whether these workers are worth the salaries they are awarded. They certainly are. The more relevant question is: Can we afford it? The answer to that is "No."

Locust Valley Clock Fixed

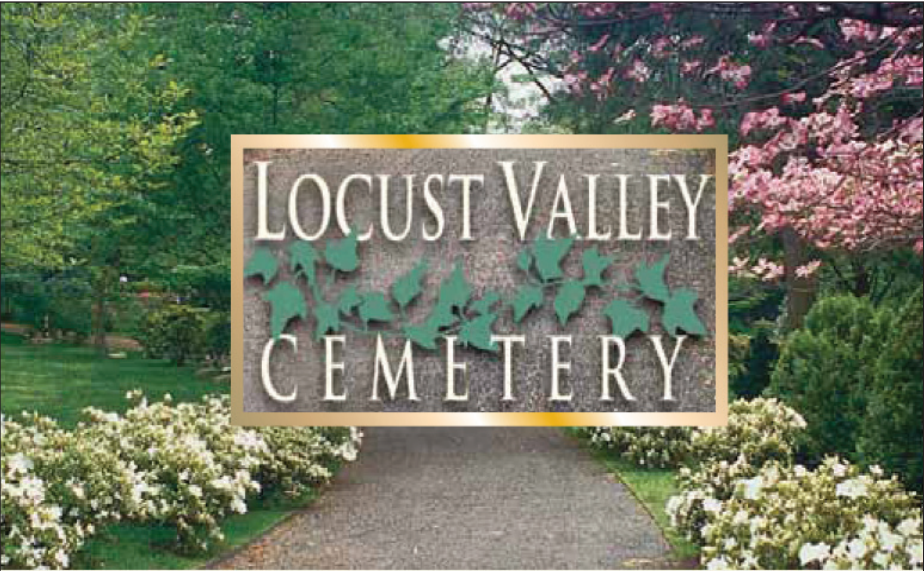


The Locust Valley Rotary held a Re-Dedication Ceremony of the Town Clock, on Saturday, November 6th at 10:00 am.
