



Protests to Stop Biden Shutdown of Northport VA Hospital

The Veterans administration under President Joe Biden has announced plans to shut-down the Northport Veterans Administration Hospital, which was met with immediate strong protests by local veterans and officials.

A mass protest meeting was held this past Monday against the proposed shutdown, with hundreds of veterans, and state, county, town and federal officials present to oppose the Biden plan.

"We have the largest concentration of veterans here, 80,000 to 90,000 of them, and they get the full gamut of services," stated Suffolk County Treasurer John Kennedy (R-Smithtown). "It is completely wrong headed thing to want to eliminate this primary care campus. It just won't work, and veterans deserve better."

Also attending the protest rally were Suffolk County Executive Steve Bellone; Suffolk Legislators Kevin McCaffrey, Stephanie Bontempi, Manny Esteban, and Rob Trotta; US Senator Chuck Schumer, Huntington Supervisor Ed Smyth, and Huntington Town Councilmen Sal Ferro and Joan Cergol.

"I stand with our veterans and any loss of services or shutdown of the Northport VA Hospital," stated Councilman Sal Ferro.

US Senator Chuck Schumer,

the Majority Leader of the US Senate tried to explain away the Biden plan, stating "I don't know if he [Biden] even knows about this stupid plan yet," adding that "Veterans risked their lives and their health for us and the very least we should be doing in return is providing them with top notch health care."

The Biden administration announced last week, in an 82-page Report, that it was going to massively reduce the services available at the VA Hospital - "all but shutter it" according to Schumer - and have local veterans use medical outpatient services through area hospitals and critical care facilities.

Suffolk County VFW Commander Sabrina Lacy summed-up the sentiments of the hundreds of veterans present, saying "I'll be damned if you are going to take away my Northport VA Hospital."

MASS HYSTERIA AND CHILD MASKING

You have all seen them...

One person in a car - driving alone. In his or her own car. All alone. Wearing a huge face mask. Sometimes even a shield too. All alone.

Or a person walking outside on the sidewalk - all alone. On a quiet suburban street. No one else around. Double masked. And wearing a clear face shield. All alone.

What exactly are these solo mask wearers protecting themselves against? The truth is that they are masking not against any disease - but only against their irrational fears and psychological demons.

The Covid pandemic - a very real and often fatal disease - also awoke the delusional fears of so many, whose over-reactions can only be described as delusional and "Germophobic."

Germophobia is a psychological condition, defined as the unreasonable fear of disease and infection. It is often associated with obsessive-compulsive disorder. Some recent well known Germophobes include Howard Hughes, Saddam Hussein, Howie Mandel and Donald Trump.

Hughes locked himself away in his home and wouldn't touch anyone without wearing gloves. Trump - for decades - refused to shake other people's hands.

But the worst of these irrational fears has been the forced masking of children. Today - with the pandemic over - preschoolers, kindergarten kids and toddlers in pre-K are being forcibly masked in New York City. Today. Right now.

Never mind that otherwise healthy kids have a near-zero mortality rate from Covid. Never mind that forced child masking has been deemed "child abuse" by parents and medical professionals due to the developmental and psychological damage done to children from extended masking.

Both Germophobia and Mass Hysteria are recurring phenomena in human history: The Salem Witch Trials were provoked by girls mass imagining older women to be witches; the "Dance Manias" of the Middle Ages saw thousands of people "get infected" by spirits and demons and just start twirling and waving arms; the 2011 LeRoy School (upstate New York) mass Tourette attack with hundreds of students coughing uncontrollably; the 1962 June Bug hysteria in South Carolina of mass fainting.

A healthy society evaluates risks and disease based upon sound medical and scientific data. Not irrational hysteria. It is time for our society to stop allowing our hysterics to control our lives and public policy.

THE TYRANNY OF A LAWLESS GOVERNOR

To the Editor:

New York is on the edge of perhaps the most significant legal battle of our lifetime. A Long Island legal case under appeal called Demetriou v NYS Department of Health has the potential to redefine our state - and allow unelected government bureaucrats to control all aspects of our lives, and our bodies.

Democratic government in America was created with three branches, all equal in power. This separation of powers is perhaps the most critical tenet of both the New York State and United States Constitutions. It is what keeps us from becoming - like Putin's Russia - a dictatorship. And this delicate balance is in dire peril.

Freedom is NOT something given to us from the government. It is endowed by our Creator and inalienable, but when creating a government, the founders set up a system of checks and balances, to protect this precious freedom.

The legislative branch of government is elected by citizens to represent our wants through the writing of laws. The executive branch is supposed to execute and enforce the laws. The judicial branch evaluates laws in the court system. Without this balance, the tyranny that drove the thirteen colonies to become a sovereign nation - and drove millions of people from foreign dictatorships to immigrate here - will take hold here too.

Governor Kathy Hochul, who took office last August, seized unprecedented powers, when she avoided the legislative branch, and declared a new "public emergency" - with no approval from the Legislature, and no public comment.

Hochul - who was never elected Governor - and her unelected official bureaucrats - created incredibly sweeping and intrusive rules and regulations, without any law to back them. Her attitude was that the government can do whatever they want to, whenever they want to. Ask no questions - and do as you are told.

Long Island attorney Chad LaVeglia sued Governor Hochul, on the grounds that Hochul's imposition of her post-pandemic mask and vaccine mandates are unconstitutional, because she sidestepped the Legislature and acted on fiat.

He won! And Governor's about-face on forced child masking has everything to do with LaVeglia's huge win.

But Governor Hochul is appealing - and now she is throwing all the weight and power of the state government against LaVeglia. If Hochul wins on appeal, then government officials can - in perpetuity - avoid the legislative process, exercise authority through executive regulations rather than laws - and do whatever they want to you.

It is worth repeating that New Yorkers have already been unconstitutionally forced to follow regulations and not laws. When we allow elected officials to hijack the legal process enshrined in the Constitution to assert their own power, we are consenting to despotism.

If Governor Hochul wins her appeal, it is a new era for this country. No longer will it be WE THE PEOPLE. Instead, a precious document which stands as a beacon of light in the world, will become worthless overnight. This document has called out to the weak and the suffering around the world for generations promising them FREEDOM; It is worth defending.

If Governor Hochul wins, we will be governed by executive regulations - and not laws. Imagine what that looks like; one crisis after another - some crises real, some exaggerated, some manufactured, and some crises just completely made-up - to allow power to be taken from the people and given to the Governor's bureaucrats.

It's time to stand up and stop these would-be tyrants. It is time to say "This is our hill - and you will not take it."

Op-Ed: Is Pre-K Effective?

A key component of President Biden's proposed build back better program is a multi-hundred billion dollar spending program on universal Pre-K kindergarten for our nation's four-year-olds.

It almost seems universal from politicians on both sides of the aisle to the media analyst to the man and woman on the street that this is such a glorious thing worthy of such an enormous investment. Being against spending must mean you're against kids.

But does the program actually work? And if it doesn't, why are we continuing to funnel money into this program when that money is being diverted for perhaps more productive academic avenues?

We've always wondered why the Pre-K programs have been placed on a pedestal. This is not a new program. It's been in effect for over a generation. If it was such a greatly successful program wouldn't we be seeing dramatically improved academic achievement? We aren't.

A new study from Vanderbilt University that shows that Pre-K programs had no positive effect on the students who were enrolled in it. In fact, many of those enrolled wound up doing worse.

The study lasted more than a decade. It included 2,990 low-income children in Tennessee who applied to free, public prekindergarten programs. Some were admitted by lottery, and the others were rejected, creating the closest thing you can get in the real world to a randomized, controlled trial — the gold standard in showing causality in science.

The study followed both groups of children all the way through sixth grade. At the end of their first year, the kids who went to Pre-K scored higher on school readiness — as expected.

But after third grade, they were doing worse than the control group. And at the end of sixth grade, they were doing even worse. They had lower test scores, were more likely to be in special education, and were more likely to get into trouble

in school, including serious trouble like suspensions.

Most Americans over 40 years old had our first days of class in kindergarten. Many of us never had even a nursery school to attend. But somehow we learned to read and write. In fact most born in earlier generations were at home until they were five or six years of age.

Of course, times change. The two-parent working family is now extremely common.

So we recognize that the need for affordable childcare is indeed a very important issue in our culture and society.

But Pre-K is a far more bureaucratic and expensive proposition than standard Daycare.

70% of children under five are today enrolled in Pre-K. We could make the argument that the enhanced expense for Pre-K over Daycare would be worth it if we could see positive results from those students going to the program. To be fair, you can find some studies that show some benefits after the first few years of a child being in the program. There are numerous studies showing that where there are early benefits, they dissipate as the children enter middle school and high school.

Parents and taxpayers must be more skeptical of the politicians promising to spend hundreds of billions of dollars to "help" their children with these feel-good, but useless, "solutions."

The biggest crime with all this wasteful spending is not that we overtax our residents, but rather, that we have pretended to help our children, when in fact that money could have been used instead toward programs that actually would benefit children.



Local Author Pens Thrilling Mystery Novel





New Yoga Studio in Glen Cove

Local resident Jason Samel will open a new yoga studio soon in Glen Cove called Buddha Jams Yoga at 192 Glen Street. Yoga teacher, Reiki master, musician, record, concert, and festival producer, social and environmental activist, as well as Affordable Care Act Expert, and manager of his wife's Veterinary Hospital in Glen Cove, Jason Samel says that he has finally found his space. His story is an interesting and complicated one. "When COVID gripped the globe, the ancestral, childhood, and lifelong trauma we were all faced with was immeasurable. During that time, as an uncomfortably large man, at 5'6" and 235 pounds and deeply depressed, my memories surfaced of childhood abuse at residential schools and beyond. Instead of getting angry as I often did, I eventually turned to my breath, and the connection one finds in life when they match breath and movement on their mat." Samel then continued, "After only one year of practicing yoga daily, at age forty four, I lost 75 pounds, and attained the

greatest physical and mental health state I'd ever achieved. Quickly I developed a happiness and practice that I wanted to share with the world and soon dreamed of opening a yoga studio where I could do just that."

Jason Samel said that he intends to give everyone, regardless of socioeconomic status, an opportunity to make yoga part of their daily lives. Jason's long history of activism for equality certainly shines in his studio where any Medicaid and Medicare enrollees receive 50% off of Buddha Jams regular class prices. Jason will also teach a free yoga class outdoors in front of his studio five days a week, depending on weather and safety issues.

Samel said that he built his studio around the idea that a jam can only occur when all are welcome. Samel concluded by saying, "It is only that moment when we can hear an authentic sound of aum, or ohm, the sound of everything, and everyone. It is in this space we can connect and find love, and kindness towards all."

Most people are familiar with yoga and meditation, but not necessarily Reiki, which is a Japanese form of healing. In Japanese the word Rei means the wisdom of God, or a higher power, depending on your belief system, and Ki means healing, or the life force. Although Reiki is a spiritual healing method it is not a religion.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that said Budget Vote and Election will be held on Tuesday, May 17, 2022, between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m., prevailing time, in the three (3) Election Districts, described below, at which time the polls will be open to vote by voting machine upon the following items:

1. Proposition One (1): To adopt the annual budget of the School District for the fiscal year 2022-2023 and to authorize the requisite portion thereof to be raised by taxation on the taxable property of the District.

There is a seat available which is vacant due to the resignation of a prior Board of Education member. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be deemed elected to fill the remainder of the term of the vacant seat until June 30, 2022 and then a full three year term commencing July 1, 2022 and expiring on June 30, 2025.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a copy of the statement of the amount of money which will be required to fund the School District's budget and the Locust Valley Library's budget for 2022-2023, exclusive of public monies, may be obtained by any resident of the District between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. beginning April 26, 2022, except Saturday, Sunday or holidays, at the District Office, 22 Horse Hollow Road, Locust Valley, New York 11560 and at each school house in the District.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that military voters who are not currently registered may apply to register as a qualified voter of the Locust Valley Central School District by requesting and returning a registration application to the District Clerk in person, by mail to Office of the District Clerk, 22 Horse Hollow Road, Locust Valley, NY 11560, by email to shammerschmidt@lvcasd.k12.ny.us or fax sent to 516 277-5098.
